Part 2 Task Card #1 (Advertisements) 1 minute to prepare notes, then speak for up to 2 minutes.

Describe an advertisement that persuaded you to buy a product.

You should say

- What advertisement was it?
- Was it shown on TV, radio, newspaper or some other type of media?
- What was good about that advertisement?

and explain why you think that the advertisement made the product seem attractive.

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Part 2 Task Card #2 (Art) 1 minute to prepare notes, then speak for up to 2 minutes.

You should say:

- what is it?
- how do you know about it?
- how much would it cost you?

and explain why you want to have it in your home.

You should say:

- what business it would be?
- when you want to start it?
- why you have not started it yet?

and explain why you want to start this business.
